

## PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, highly pathogenic avian influenza is a contagious and economically devastating disease that has threatened turkeys, chickens, and other poultry in our state; and

justification for the issuance of a Proclamation of a State of Disaster Emergency; and property and exhaust local resources and capacities unless its spread is stopped, which provides legal health, and safety of the citizens of the State of Iowa and has the potential to quickly destroy private WHEREAS, the spread of this highly contagious disease continues to threaten the public peace.

WHEREAS, Iowa poultry producers typically dispose of animal manure generated by their facilities under the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 200A; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code § 200A.3 (6) requires that animal manure must be "unmanipulated" and composed "primarily of animal excreta" in order to be considered "dry animal nutrient product" to come under the regulation of Iowa Code Chapter 200A.
