

## PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY

confirmed cases of highly pathogenic avian influenza in the state of lowa; and WHEREAS, beginning on May 27, 2024, and continuing thereafter, there have been

devastating disease that has threatened turkeys, chickens, and other poultry in our state; and WHEREAS, highly pathogenic avian influenza is a contagious and economically

WHEREAS, the spread of this highly contagious disease continues to threaten the public peace, health, and safety of the citizens of the State of Iowa and has the potential to quickly destroy private property and exhaust local resources and capacities unless its spread is stopped, which provides legal justification for the issuance of a Proclamation of a State of Disaster

their facilities under the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 200A; and WHEREAS, Iowa poultry producers typically dispose of animal manure generated by

WHEREAS, strict compliance with the provisions of lowa law related to composting facilities and permit application requirements for composting facilities would prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with this disaster in the affected county; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code § 200A.3 (6) requires that animal manure must be "unmanipulated" and composed "primarily of animal excreta" in order to be considered "dry animal nutrient product" to come under the regulation of Iowa Code Chapter 200A. As defined, animal manure under the authority of Iowa Code Chapter 200A; and infected by highly pathogenic avian influenza by making them ineligible to dispose of their Iowa Code § 200A.3 (6) creates a particular hardship for turkey and chicken producers on sites

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KIMBERLY K. REYNOLDS, Governor of the State of Iowa, by the power and authority vested in me by the Iowa Constitution Art. IV, §§ 1, 8 and Iowa Code §§ 29C.6 (1), 163.1, 163.3A (2) and all other applicable laws, and in conjunction with the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship, and the authority granted to it under Iowa Code § 163.3A, do hereby proclaim a STATE OF DISASTER EMERGENCY specifically for Sac County and do hereby ORDER and DIRECT the following:

SECTION NINE. I temporarily suspend the regulatory provisions of Iowa Code §§ 321.463 (6) (a) and (b) for certain loads transported on all highways within Iowa, excluding the interstate system, for commercial vehicle drivers hauling loads related to the response to this disaster during its duration, when such loads:

- A. Do not exceed a maximum of 90,000 pounds gross weight,
- Ä Do not exceed by more than twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) the maximum axle in Iowa Code § 321.463 weight limit determined under the non-primary highway maximum gross weight table (б) (б),
- $\bigcirc$ Do not exceed the legal maximum axle weight limit of 20,000 pounds, and
- D. Comply with posted weight limits on roads and bridges
