

## TARGETED FUNDING TO IMPROVE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

\$102.7 million for the innovative Teacher Leadership and Compensation System

### Targeted Funding to Raise Student Achievement



Students participating in 2014-2015 STEM Scale-Up programs scored 6% higher in both math and science than their peers who didn't participate in STEM Scale-Up programs.



Iowa Department of Education data shows that statewide reading proficiency increased by 4.3% from the 2012-2013 school year compared to the 2014-2015 school year, based on preliminary school year data.



According to the Iowa Department of Education, Iowa students' statewide math proficiency increased by 2.7% from the 2012-2013 school year compared to the 2014-2015 school year, based on preliminary school year data.



Iowa's high school graduation rate is at 90%, the highest in the nation.
